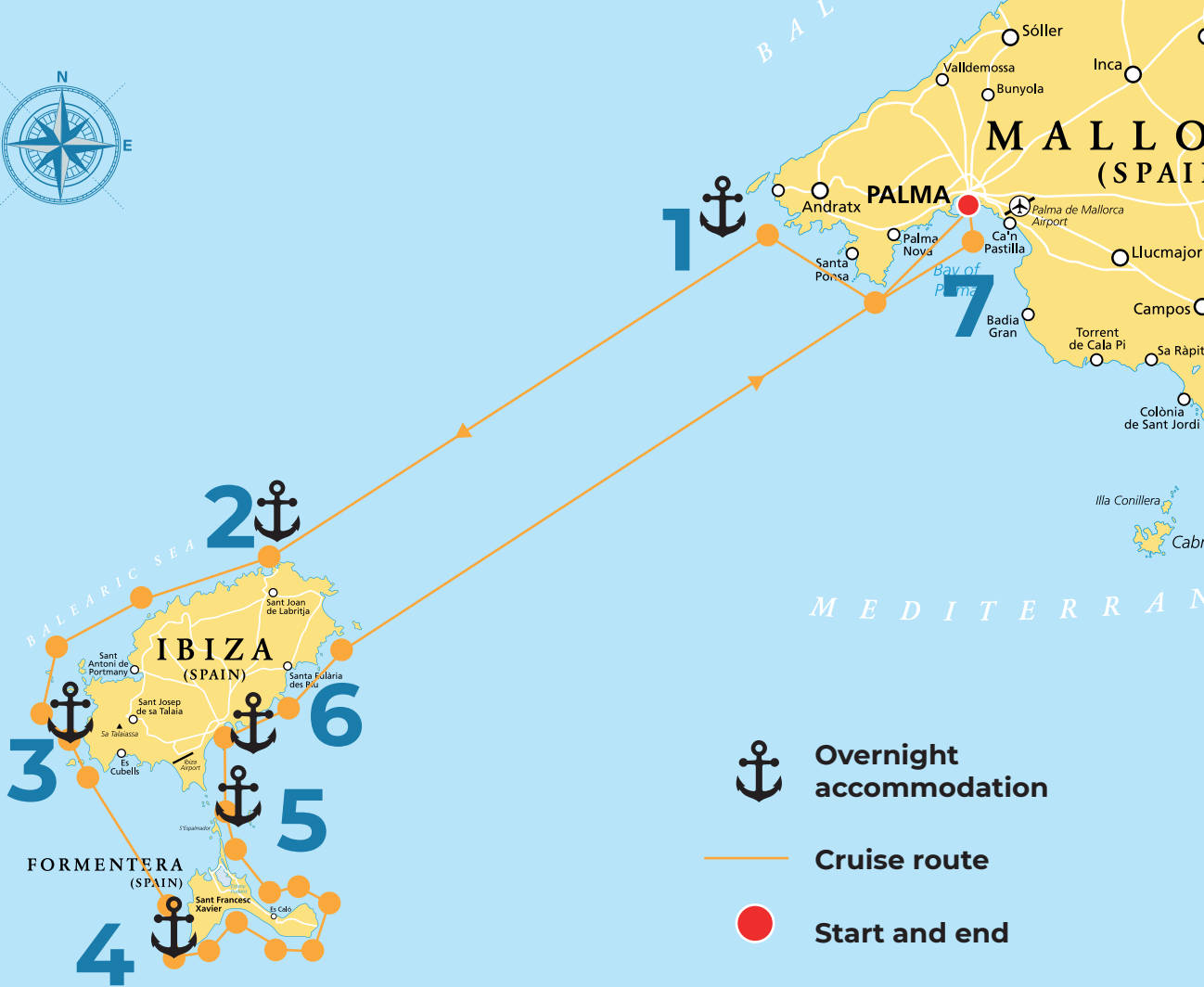
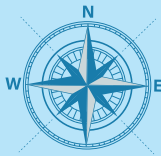

Another unique Mallorcan town, Puerto Pollença has beautiful scenery and a deeply traditional heritage. Early 20th-century wealthy families from Madrid and Palma made Puerto Pollença their summer escape. For good reason too – here you will find peaceful family-friendly vibes and crystal clear waters. Take part in the tradition of an evening paseo, or stroll, along the Pine Walk that runs along the bay, where the beach is lined by deep green pine trees, and palm trees.

## FROM PUERTO POLLENSA TO CALA RATJADA

As the closest point between Mallorca and Menorca, Cala Rajada has always been a valuable hub for trade, commerce and business. On a clear day, it is easy to see the town of Ciutadella in Menorca. Cala Ratjada is the main port in the town of Capdepera and its city centre is a happening place. Shop along the main street of L'Agulla Elinor Servera and visit the weekly Sunday market at Plaça del Pins. Immersing yourself in the natural beauty of Cala Rajada is another option. You can enjoy the beautiful white sand beach of Cala Agulla, which is also a protected bird sanctuary, or you can take in the views from the 19th-century lighthouse at Punta de Capdepera.

On the last stop in our Mallorca sailing itinerary, you will get to explore the locals' favorite get-away. Reminiscent of Mallorca's pre-tourism boom, Cabrera feels a world away. Reminiscent of Mallorca, pre-tourism boom, Cabrera feels a world away. As a protected national park, there is an abundance of birds, marine life, and flora and fauna. During your stay, you may catch a glimpse of cormorants, falcons, ospreys, or dolphins, among much other wildlife. Apart from its animal inhabitants, Cabrera has been home to a military base where thousands of captive soldiers stayed imprisoned during the Napoleonic wars. Dig into the history of the island by touring the Castle of Cabrera or the 19th-century lighthouse, L'Enciola, which are both accessible by foot and provide a nice hike.

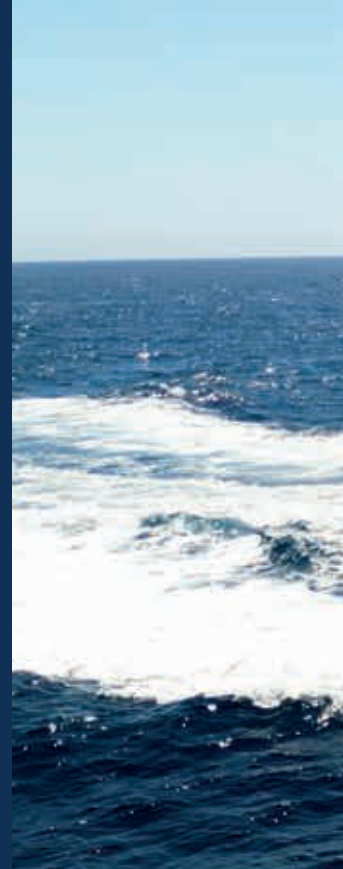
